Application and Payment Procedure:

Machine Preparation:

It is suggested that all students ride a "sport bike" type, road-legal or track prepared machine, but this is NOT a requirement. The purpose of the school is to allow each student an opportunity to work on their riding skills. Riders will be grouped according to the size of their bike and riding skill. In order to get the most out of the school prepare your bike in advance of the race school. Use the list below as a guide to prepare your bike.

- Each machine must arrive in the morning fueled up and ready to go.
- All bikes must be in safe and roadworthy condition.
 - Students must ensure that tires, brakes, and chain are all in excellent condition.
- The following must be taped over or removed
 - all glass and plastic lenses: instruments (except tach.), reflectors, headlights, signal lights, taillights, and mirrors.
- Each bike must have a functional engine kill switch.
- **NO ANTIFREEZE:** replace your coolant with distilled water (and water wetter if desired)

Each rider's bike and protective gear will be checked at technical inspection prior to the start of the school.

Riding Gear:

All students must bring and wear the following items for the on-track portions of the Race School.

- Full face Helmet: the helmet must be in good condition with an undamaged face shield and compliant with one of the following helmet ratings.
 - Snell M2005
 - ECE 22-04 and ECE-22-05 (P or J)
 - BS 6658 Grade A (Road Racing)
 - JIS T 8133 : 2003
- Full Leathers (one piece or two piece zip together)
 - If these are not available the following substitutions may be made but Full Leathers are highly recommended.
 - A full Textile riding suite that zips together.
 - A Leather Jacket with Leather Pants suitably joined together
 - Note: no jeans or non-leather motocross gear will be accepted.
- Leather Gloves that cover the wrists and overlap with the leather's sleeves
- Riding Boots that cover the ankles.

Roadrace School Course Description:

The EMRA has developed a school to allow motorcycle enthusiasts a safe and informative opportunity to develop and refine their street riding and racing skills. A classroom session will cover bike preparation, rider preparation, proper racing lines, braking and cornering techniques as well as crash avoidance. For track sessions the students don their protective gear and join their designated small groups for individual riding instruction from their instructors. (Riders will be in groups with others of similar ability and equipment.)

Additional EMRA Race School Information

Students who pass the EMRA Race School will be given an EMRA Novice competition license. If the student does not participate in a minimum of one event two years after taking the school then the student's Novice license will be cancelled and they will be required to take another race school.
